



Cops for Cancer

Each September teams of committed police and emergency service personnel from across the province join the Canadian Cancer Society's Cops for Cancer. They sign on to cycle between 7 and 14 days, covering hundreds of kilometers, all to benefit children and families living with cancer.

The four tours – on Vancouver Island, in Northern BC, along the coast of BC and in the Fraser Valley – wind their way through more than 100 BC communities, giving those places an opportunity to get involved with local fundraising events and activities.

The Junior Team – inspiration for the journey

Junior Team members are often guests of honour at Cops training, promotional and fundraising events in the months leading up to the tour. The riders value the opportunity to meet Junior Team members. Often Junior Team members share personal stories about their fight against cancer, as well as their experiences with Canadian Cancer Society programs like Camp Goodtimes. Junior Team members attend the launch and final day of the tour and may even take part for a short time.

Local media are interested in interviewing Junior Team members if they are comfortable.

- to be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all Cops for Cancer events
- to meet Cops for Cancer tour riders
- to receive Cops for Cancer promotional items
- to be respected and valued for their commitment to Cops for Cancer

All Junior Team members must be under 18 years of age and have used a Canadian Cancer Society service or program.
